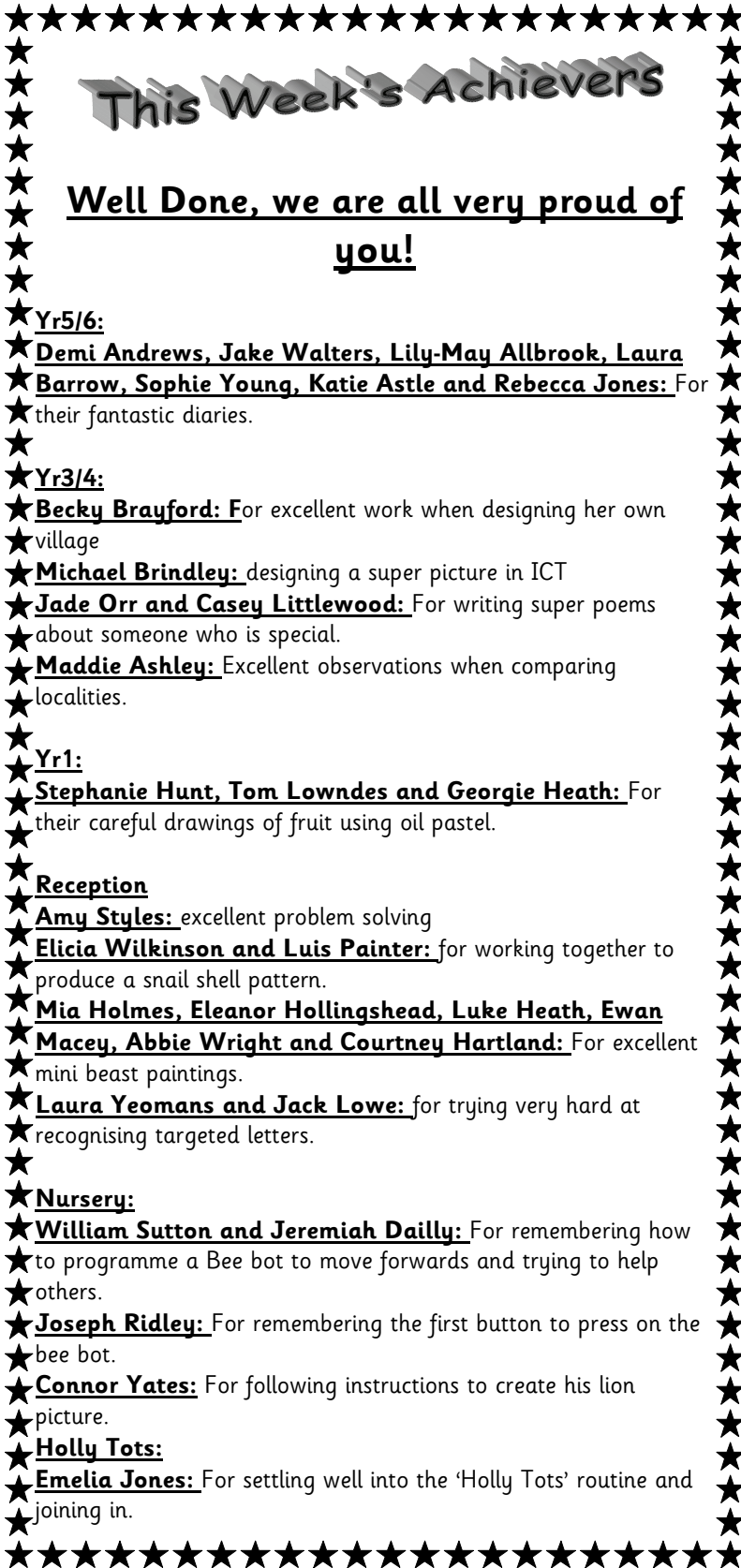

Lunchtime vacancies

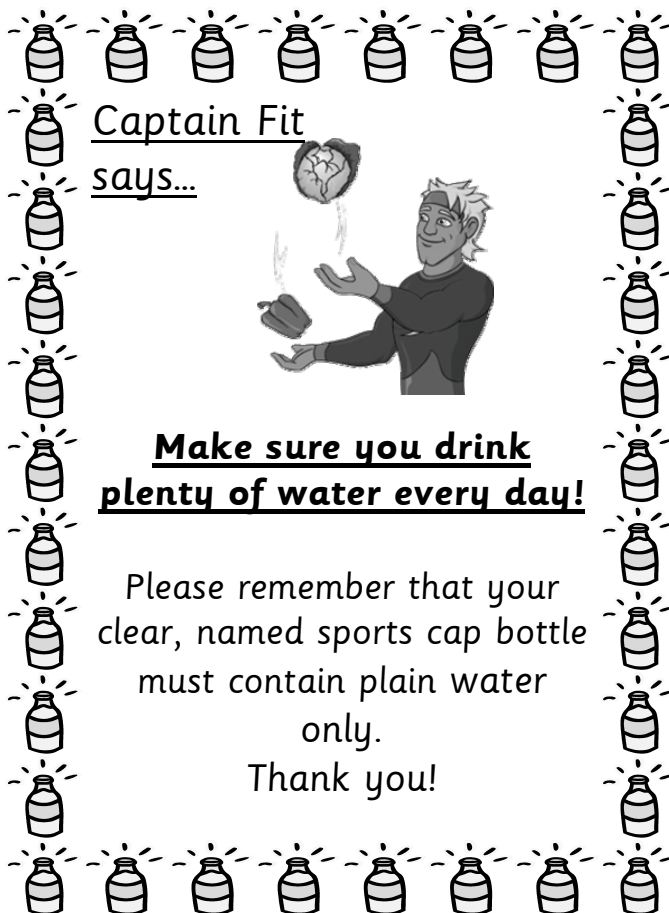

Medicines
